

2009 PRESTATE ANALYSIS (POST STATE ANALYSIS BELOW)

First State Appearances

Six teams will make their first State appearance, three girls' teams and three boys'. For the girls, 3A Prairie, 1A Northwest, and B Waitsburg-Prescott. The boys have 4A Thomas Jefferson, B Davenport and B Bickelton.

Longest Gaps Since Last State Appearance

The *Deer Park boys* will compete at State for the first time since 1976. The 32 years between appearances is long but the Stags are not close to the record. Winlock (40, 1960-2001) was topped last year by the Naselle Comets record of 42 years between appearances (1965-2008). The 42 years between appearances by the Naselle Comets breaks the State record previously held by Winlock (40, 1960-2001).

The last time the *R A Long girls* competed at State the 3.0 mile course was still at Evergreen High School in Seattle. In 1980 they placed 14th in the 2A division. The Jills' 28 year gap (1980-2009) has now broken the record of 26 years between appearances by Meadowdale girls (1978-2005).

A big year for returning teams as seven other teams also return after 13 years or more. Welcome back Garfield (13, 1995-2009), Cascade-Everett (14, 1994-2009), Toppenish (17, 1991-2009), Interlake, (17, 1991-2009), Kamiakin (18, 1990-2009), Stadium (18, 1990-2009), and White River (19, 1989-2009).

Longest State Streaks Extended (some things stay the same.)

The *Blanchet boys* will make their 32nd consecutive State appearance and 43rd overall, both Washington State records. The *Lakewood boys* will compete in their 26th consecutive State meet, the second-longest streak in Washington history.

The *Bellarmino Prep girls* extend their string to 13 consecutive State appearances. Among girls' teams, Seattle's Lakeside (21, 1977-1997) and South Kitsap (16, 1989-2004) have the longest streaks.

For the 8th consecutive year, *Sehome* has qualified both boys and girls. The State record for consecutive qualifications of both teams is 15 years (Gig Harbor, 1987-2001). Sehome's boys and girls also earned trophies the last four years in a row.

Most Historically Accomplished Programs Not to Qualify (the mighty have fallen.)

Mead boys. Nothing says change like the legendary panthers not going to state. Heck they didn't even make it to regionals after finishing 4th 4A at the insanely tough GSL championships. After 14 titles and a streak of 21 years the mighty panthers showed that they are not inhuman.

Omak boys. The great team of the 90's, the Pioneers haven't qualified for State since 2000, but won 7 titles in the 20th century and finished in the top-4 a total of 16 times.

Mount Baker girls. The Lady Mountaineers have won 5 State titles and finished in the top-4 12 other times. Their 26 State appearances rank second to Bellarmino Prep among girls' programs but have not gone to state since 2004.

Edmonds-Woodway boys. Counting the histories of both predecessor schools, the Warriors have 7 championships to their credit, including 6 between 1982 and 1990, and their 35 State appearances rank second to Blanchet.

King's boys. The Knights amassed 9 trophies and a streak of 4 titles in a row but failed to qualify for the second time in three years. Their streak of 16 years to state ended in 2006 in an increasingly tough Tri District.

South Whidbey girls. The falcons have won 13 trophies and have 24 appearances but haven't been to state since 2007. The tough northwest district ended their streak of 16 years to state in 2005.

Snohomish girls. The legendary teams of the early 00's have been hit hard by the splitting of the school and Glacier Peak's emergence. The panthers earned 7 trophies this decade but their 10 year streak ended this year.

Newport-Bellevue girls. The knights have earned 5 trophies this decade and just won it all in 2007 but their streak of 15 years to state ended this year.

Squalicum girls. The storm had an amazing run this decade of 7 straight trophies including 3 titles. The tough northwest district takes down another legend as the streak of 8 years ends.

2009 POST-STATE ANALYSIS

WASHINGTON STATE HIGH SCHOOL CROSS COUNTRY HISTORY

Washington high school cross country traces its state championship history back to 1959. (The Washington Interscholastic Activities Association started sanctioning the State meet a decade later, and girls got a championship meet in 1973.) Some of the interesting facts and figures of the 51 State meets are summarized below. To rank teams, I award 10 points for a championship, 7 points for finishing second, 5 points for third, 3 points for fourth and 1 point for any other State appearance.

ALL-TIME GREATEST BOYS' PROGRAMS

1) **Mead High School** (228 points) has, by far, the greatest boys' cross country program in Washington history. The Panthers have

won a record 15 State titles, including 9 in a row from 1988 to 1996, and have finished no lower than 3rd for 21 straight years (1998-2008). While Mead has 11 individual titles and has had 54 boys on the podium at state, the Panthers showed their mortality and did not qualify a team in 2009. They have a long way to go before anyone will unseat them as the role model of the state.

2) Despite brutal competition from cross-town rival Mead, **Ferris** (153) has won 7 titles in the State's largest classification, including 4 straight from 2003 to 2006. The Saxons have 13 other top-4 finishes as well as 6 individual titles and 46 podium placers. Ferris jumps over Blanchet, and moves into second place with their 2009 title.

3) Consistent, consistent, consistent. **Blanchet** (149) has competed at State a record 43 times, including the last 32 years in a row. The Braves have won 8 titles during that stretch along with 5 individual titles. They've been 4th or better 17 times and placed 33 runners on the podium. In only two years (1959 and 1961) have one of the top 3 teams not been at the state meet and in 14 years all three have appeared.

4) **Omak** (129) has won 7 State titles as the greatest small school program in Washington history. The Pioneers have 16 total top-4 finishes in 28 State appearances. Omak has won 3 individual titles and placed 24 runners on the podium but has not had a team at state since 2000.

5) With four 3A championships and two runner-up finishes in the last six years, **North Central** (112) reprises early success. Between 1971 and 1987 the Indians finished 4th or better 8 times, including capturing the 3A title in 1977. NC is moving up quickly into legendary status jumping 4 spots in one year.

6) Counting the histories of both of its predecessor schools, **Edmonds-Woodway** (110) has 7 championships to its credit, including six between 1982 and 1990. The Warriors' 35 State appearances rank second to Blanchet but has not been at state since 2005. A true team model as E-W trophies have come with only one individual title and only 19 podium placers.

7) Despite not having competed at State since 1995, **Richland** (103) has 24 appearances, finishing 4th or better 13 times, including 5 straight titles in the early 1970s. That run made the Bombers the dominant team of Washington cross country's first three decades. Richland holds the distinction as the best program not to have won an individual title but has placed 17 runners on the podium at state. Along with Omak and Edmonds-Woodway, Richland's early history has them in the fading legends category.

8) **Seattle Prep** (102) has won 3 championships, each in a different decade. The Panthers have finished among the top 4 on 15 occasions to go along with 3 individual titles. With 8 straight trophies (2002-2009) Prep along with North Central look to be legends in the making.

9) Fast rising **Burlington-Edison** (92) has won 3 titles in the last 4 years to move into the top 10. The Tigers as still looking for their first individual title but has placed 24 individuals on the podium.

10) **King's** (84) then King's Garden finished 22nd and last in the very first State meet in 1959. The Knights have avenged that ignominy with 4 titles, 3 runner-up finishes and a streak of 16 State appearances. King's has won 3 individual titles and had 25 runners climb the podium at state, but has failed to qualify at team in two of the last three years.

10) The second-most accomplished school since 1990, **Saint George's** (84) has won three B titles along with one individual title. The Dragons have finished in the top 4 eight other times and marched 19 runners up the steps at state. Since 1990, King's and S.G. have been the most consistent small school programs. Interesting that they are now tied for the last spot on the legends list. 2010?

- 1) **Mount Baker** - The Mountaineers (121 points) won titles in their first two State meets (1977 and 1978) and have added three more since. They have earned 2 individual titles and have placed a record 32 girls on the podium at state. The Mountaineers have finished in the top-4 17 times and never been lower than 7th when they qualify. Their 26 State appearances are the 2nd highest total for a girls' team. However Mount Baker hasn't been to state since 2004.
- 2) **Gig Harbor** - Like Mount Baker, the Tides (111) won it all in their first State meet (1980) and have five titles total. They've finished among the top-4 nine other times, and have qualified for State 22 of the last 23 years. The Tides have won 3 individual titles and have placed 23 girls on the podium. They might be able to catch Mt. Baker next year.
- 3) **Eisenhower** - As the greatest girls' program east of the Cascades, the Cadets (102) have won four titles, five times been runners-up, and collected a total of 12 trophies. They have won 2 individual titles and placed 24 runners on the podium but have only scored 4 points since 2003.
- 4) **Saint George's** - First qualifying for State in 1992, the Dragons (101) won 5 titles in an eight-year stretch and have 9 other top-4 finishes. They have won 3 individual titles, have placed 28 girls on the podium and are by far the best B girl's program.
- 4) **Chelan** - The Goats (101) have won 4 titles, including 3 straight 1988-1990, and have finished in the top-3 on 9 other occasions. They must have had great depth as they have only had 11 girls on the podium and have never won an individual title.
- 6) **Bellarmino Prep** - The Lions (98) have more State appearances (30) than any other girls' team and are pushing a streak of 13 straight appearances. They've won 4 championships in those 30 trips, plus posted 9 other top-4 finishes. B.Pre has won 3 individual titles and placed 29 girls on the podium.
- 7) **Riverside** - The Rams (97) have won 2 titles and finished in the top-4 an additional 14 times. Another team of depth as they have never won an individual title and have only had 12 girls on the podium.
- 8) **South Whidbey** - The Falcons (95) haven't won a championship since 1979, but they've been runners-up a record 8 times and have a total of 13 top-4 finishes. They also have never won an individual title and have only scored 3 points since 2003. S.W. does have the second longest girl's streak of 16 years to state (1989-2004) and have made 24 appearances.
- 9) **Omak** - The dominant program during the 1990s, the Pioneers (91) won 4 championships between 1992 and 1998. They've placed in the top-4 a total of 13 times but have only scored 3 points since 2001. Omak has one individual title but has placed 30 girls on the podium.
- 10) **Snohomish** - Runners-up in the first two girls' State meets, the Panthers (89) finally captured their first title in 1995 and have won 3 more since. They've been top-4 a total of 12 times with a streak of 10 years (1999-2008) along with 21 appearances. The Panthers' 2002 and 2003 teams are arguably the best teams in state history but the school split in 2008 and now has cross town rival Glacier Peak to deal with.
- 10) **King's** - With only 4 appearances before this decade, King's (89) earns a record 7 Titles (4 in a row) along with two 2nds. The 85 points since 2000 scores as the best female decade ever. 2nd place is Omak of the 90's with 61. If not for the 2 year opt up to 2A, the Lady Knights might have topped Mead's decade record of 89 points. Lady Knights have won 3 individual titles and placed 26 runners on the podium. King's moved up quickly into the top 10 but how long will the streak of titles and appearances go on.

OTHER NOTABLE FACTS AND FIGURES

PARITY (sometimes everything changes.) New schools emerging. Competition rising. Some districts make getting to state as tough as state itself. The times are changing and with the new classifications coming in 2010 they will keep changing.

THEY CAN THROW A PARTY BUT CAN'T DANCE.

Pasco is the greatly appreciated host of the state meet but their boys or girls have never scored.

WELCOME BACK IN A BIG WAY.

Shadle Park girls won in 2009 after a 6 year absence.
Northwest Christian-Colbert placed 3rd after a 10 year absence.

FREQUENTLY A BRIDE.

Shadle Park won the first boys' State championship in 1959. Three years later in 1962 the Highlanders became the first team to win a second title. **Richland** (1972, 1973 and 1974) was the first boys team to win 3, 4 and 5 titles. **Edmonds-Woodway's** ten titles between 1982 and 1990 made them the first school to win 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 titles. Then **Mead** (2001, 2002 and 2007) became the first boys team to win 13, 14 and 15 championships.

Shoreline and **Bellevue Christian** won the first girls' State championships in 1973 but have never repeated. **Bellarmino Prep** and **Mount Baker** both won repeat titles in 1977 and 1978 to be the first girls teams to 2 titles. In 1979 **Bellarmino Prep** threepeated to be the first girls team to 3 titles. Edmonds-Woodway won their fourth title in 1985 and 6th in 1987 to be the first to 4 and 5. **King's** girls won their 6th title in 2008 and 7th in 2009 to hold the current record of titles and be the first to both 6 and 7.

PERFECTION.

The **Chief Sealth** girls first competed at State in 1975, and finished 1st of 15 teams. The girls' championship that year did not separate by classification. The Lady Seahawks have not returned to State since, making them the only team -- boys or girls -- to have a perfect record at State.

INDIVIDUAL PERFECTION.

Few individuals have been on 4 state championship teams. Obviously it is hard for a freshman to make a state championship team.

During Mead's 9 year title streak, no individual ran all four years at state. 2 boys and 7 girls have accomplished the feat.
